





Recipe: Caramelized Red Onion Tarte Tatin

(serves 2)

Perfect as a light lunch or a generous starter, this French inspired sayoury dish is a bit out of the ordinary.

3 Red Onions 250ml Balsamic Vinegar 50ml Olive Oil 2 Cloves Garlic, chopped 25g Caster Sugar 1 Sprig Thyme All Butter Puff Pastry Sea Salt



vinegar and oil has been absorbed and the onions are nicely caramelised and cooked through. Then leave them to cool.

For the base of the tart, pour the remaining vinegar and the sugar into a saucepan and reduce the liquid to a syrupy consistency. Pour the mixture into two small tart moulds or a blinis pan.

Place the onions flat side down on top of the syrup. Roll out the puff pastry to around 3-4 mm thick. Cut the pastry so it is slightly bigger than the mould you are using. Place it over the onions and tuck it in around them. Stab the pastry a few times with a fork to allow the steam to escape and leave the tarts to rest in the fridge for 20 minutes. To cook, place on a suitable baking tray and place in the middle of the oven for 15 minutes or until the pastry is brown. Let them stand for 2 minutes then carefully turn out onto plates. The tarts can be served warm or cold. I like to crumble a soft cheese such as Stilton or Goats cheese over them before serving.

Where will you be in 5 - 10 years?

If I asked you what you are doing tomorrow, you could probably tell me. You could probably tell me what you also have planned for the next week. Next month might be a bit more difficult, and this time next year almost impossible.

Opinion: Free Money Always Comes at a Price

Free money is a bit of a thing these days. I see endless adverts for it on the telly. Did you borrow some money and the lender persuaded you that it might be a good idea to insure your repayments? Did a surgeon make a mistake while diligently trying to save your life? Was your flight late? Did you make a speculative investment and lose money instead of making it? If any of these bad things have happened to you, don't worry because this is actually a chance to get some free money.

Take the PPI "miss-selling scandal." Back in the 2000s banks would lend pretty much any amount of money to anyone for any purpose. The lending market was very competitive and the fledgling comparison sites made it easy to shop around to get the best deal. Hence, it made a lot of sense to the banks to upsell insurance policies that nobody was ever likely to claim against as an easy way of boosting their profits. Then the financial crisis came along and the banks had to be bailed out with billions of pounds of taxpayers' money. Suddenly banker was a dirty word and they deserved everything they had coming to them.

Following a court case, it was deemed that any PPI sold had in fact been miss-sold and the people it had been sold to should be compensated. To date, a staggering £34 billion has been claimed with over £3 billion of that money going to claims management firms. But all this free money has come at a price; it hammered profits at the banks meaning they paid less tax to the Treasury, closed branches and made thousands of their employees redundant. And I don't believe we will ever get back the £45 billion we were forced to pump into RBS in 2008.

As for medical negligence claims, don't get me started. Yes, doctors sometimes make mistakes but when those mistakes have devastating consequences, the patient is generously compensated, usually without the case going anywhere near a court. Last year the NHS paid out £2.4 billion in medical negligence claims; in 2008 that sum was £540 million. That's over a fourfold increase in just 10 years, largely thanks to the efforts of claims management companies. You don't need me to point out that the NHS is both free at the point of use for everyone who needs it and desperately underfunded right now.

One source of free money you may not be aware of is the Help to Buy scheme. This provides an interest free loan of up to 20% of the value of a property (that's £50,000 for the average home) for five years. To qualify, all you need to do currently is buy a new build home and scrape together a 5% deposit. The scheme was meant to encourage house building and, to be fair, it has worked a treat. The house builders have stepped up to the plate and more than doubled new build completions... and who can blame them? They've also tripled the profits they make on a typical property.

The costs of this free money are high. The government has sunk £12 billion into the scheme which they are by no means guaranteed to get back. Buyers who use the scheme pay an extra £30,000 for their homes on average and, while sales of new builds may be booming, sales of existing properties are in the doldrums. This means that estate agents are struggling and people who want to move up or down the property ladder have difficulty doing so.

There is, however, one form of free money I wholeheartedly approve of and that is the compensation scheme that covers delayed flights, another contribution to our lives from the good old EU. Regular readers may recall I received £1400 in compensation from the dark empire of Ryanair after my flight to Spain was delayed by three hours. Revenge is sweet!





Don't let cold callers give you the chills as winter sets in Consumer advice by Eileen Le Voi By Safe Local Trades

Clear out your gutters. In autumn, leaves can collect in gutters and drains, leading to blocks and overflows - so it's best to clean them regularly. Consider investing in gutter leaf guards to help prevent your gutters becoming blocked in future.

Sweep your chimney. If your chimneys are in use, make sure that they get swept every year. This will remove the build-up of dirt and grime from your chimney walls.



Paul Kinally looks at what tops many people's lists for Santa at this time of year.

All over the UK home buyers and sellers have an important date in mind. No, it is not 31st October when the UK is set to come out of the European Union. This particular date will not be delayed, deferred, or cancelled. There will be no heated



This date is etched on our minds. Already shops are stocking for Christmas and very soon Marks & Spencer and John Lewis will be revealing this year's Christmas special television commercials.

Anticipation will also be rising for those hoping to move into a new home by Christmas. Historically this is a key date in the home moving calendar. It is an emotional date, a day that suggests a new start and time spent with loved ones in new surroundings - full of familiar things that make a home.

But the date can also put a great deal more stress onto an already stressful time. Why not complete a purchase two weeks later or at the end of January when things could be easier? Because it is not Christmas.

So for those aiming to have moved by Christmas here are a few hints on how to make that happen.

Children love to create sounds by tapping, banging and shaking objects and joining in with singing activities. By offering children opportunities to explore and investigate musical experiences we are helping their learning and development. 





Property: Garage Conversions in Reverse

Converting your garage into living space has long been an easy and inexpensive way of creating an extra room or perhaps a home office, particularly if it's an integrated garage. People opting for this type of conversion tend to be aiming to make their home better suited to the needs of their family. It used to be the case that 70% of garages weren't used to park a car in; instead they were a dumping ground for all the stuff that people accumulate over the years.

This is now changing due to several factors. 

Pilates: Tones the parts other exercises cannot reach!

I know the title of this article sounds a bit like a 1980's beer slogan, but it nicely simplifies one of the main aspects that differentiates the Pilates system from other forms of exercise.

In the body we have two types of skeletal muscle - movers and stabilisers. Movers make things happen, often working as pairs agonistically & antagonistically. These muscle types tend to get all the glory, because we can visually see the tone and shape of them, and their strength can easily be showcased. So typically, when we train our bodies in the gym, we'll focus on the movers and often only the 'prime movers' will get our attention. An example of this is the classic bicep curl - when the bicep muscle is contracted, it causes the elbow joint to bend, making an obvious flex - as well as the popular adage #sunsoutgunsout!

Don't get me wrong, it's great to be toned and strong but if the stabiliser muscles aren't equally attended to, injury, imbalance and impaired function can arise. The stabilisers are the lesser known muscles that support the movers, they are much smaller in size and not necessarily visible. When they are exercised regularly and become well-toned, they help prevent injury and make the body as a whole far more functional, strong and agile. Sadly though, if left alone, they will wither and won't fire up effectively when really needed, putting extra strain on joints and tendons, leading to a range of problems.

Pilates practice bridges this muscular gap. Slow, controlled movements, synced with breathing, reconnect the stabiliser muscles, building strength and developing the synergy between all the different muscle groups. This is relevant for everyone, from the body builder to the inactive office worker.

I'm sure we'd all agree that prevention is better than cure, so don't wait until you have an injury and your physio suggests you join a Pilates class. Get yourself booked in now! **Kirsty Green**



There's no doubt that living in this part of the UK has many advantages. We are surrounded by beautiful countryside and picturesque villages, have London within easy reach, Cambridge on our doorstep, and all number of stately homes and interesting places to visit.

However, life being what it is, rural living comes with its own set of issues. One of which is transport. Cuts to local services mean buses are few and far between. So for most of us a car is essential - whether to get to the station for the daily commute, to medical appointments or the nearest town. But what happens when driving is no longer an option?

Fortunately, there are alternatives, though tracking them down can be time-consuming and frustrating. And what's available largely depends on where you live.

For the over 60's who find public transport too difficult, Uttlesford Community Travel can be a godsend as can the Social Car Schemes which some villages offer to ferry residents to medical appointments. While for those who have been assessed as in medical need there's the non emergency transport service for hospital appointments.

For a comprehensive over-view of all local transport options Uttlesford Frontline offers a free fact sheet "**Getting Places**" - via **www. uttlesfordfrontline.org.uk**.

This includes: Social car schemes; bus travel - with access to route planning and timetables; DaRT (on demand) services - villages covered and booking details plus how to check whether a particular bus is accessible for anyone with mobility problems; rail travel and how to gain assistance by Greater Anglia, as well as at Stansted Airport. Details about concessionary bus passes, the Blue Badge Scheme and help available to pay travel costs for medical appointments are included together with full contact details, links and telephone numbers.

Gardening Guru: Prunella's Corner

So far this year we really haven't had a lot of rain, despite recent downpours the ground is still very dry, if you are planting make sure you water the hole before putting any plants in and then water thoroughly once you have refilled. November is the start of the bare-root planting season, (mostly roses and trees), it is also an ideal time for deciduous shrubs and trees to be planted or moved around the garden (water thoroughly before and after planting). Once the autumn leaves have all fallen the evergreens will hold the garden together, they give a garden backbone, and some can have very striking foliage colours.


Continue to cut the lawn if it has still been growing but raise the blades to keep it a bit longer, collect leaves from the lawn to add to the leaf compost. Plant and move bare-root trees, shrubs, roses and hedging. Stake newly planted trees, and now is good time to prune old trees, shrubs and climbers.

November is the best time to plant tulips bulbs, and hyacinths can still be planted. Lift and divide perennials if they have outgrown their space, chop up into about 4

pieces and replant as required. Once the leaves of dahlias have caught the frost they can be lifted, take the soil off the tubers, dry and the store in a dry, frost free place until next spring.

If vegetable borders are empty they can be dug over and have some manure or fertiliser added. Tidy strawberries and raspberry beds, parsnips and carrots can be left in the ground and be used as needed.

Used Cars: Mini Hot Hatches

The latest generation VW Golf GTi is a brilliant performance car with all the benefits of a family hatch. But it also has room for 5 tall adults, is extremely well equipped and as refined and comfortable as a Mercedes E Class. The original Golf GTi was small, noisy and about as much fun as you can have with your trousers on. A modern day city car is around the same size as that ground breaking hot hatch but few manufacturers have come up with the idea of producing a souped up version of their smallest offering – in fact, I could only come up with three of them; here they are.

VW Up GTi

My favourite city car moves up a gear with the addition of a turbocharger for its tiny 3-cylinder engine, giving it 114bhp. In such a small car that equates to 0-62 in 8.5 seconds and a top whack of 120mph. The conservative but well-proportioned styling is enhanced by 17" alloys, a rear spoiler and go faster stripes and the interior is



reminiscent of a Mark I Golf GTi, complete with tartan cloth bucket seats and red gauges. The Up might be tiny on the outside but there's plenty of room for four adults inside and everything is very well screwed together. Precise steering and tons of grip make for agile handling, though it can't quite match the grin factor of the original. It's also a bit noisy at motorway speeds but that's not going to worry most hot hatch buyers. The GTi was released quite recently so there aren't any older, cheaper cars around, though luckily the Up is pretty cheap to begin with. Expect to pay £12k for a 2018 model with 10,000 miles on the clock.

Fiat Abarth 595

The hot hatch version of Fiat's cute and curvy 500 has been around since 2008 and was rebadged as the 595 in 2015. It's a similar recipe to the Up GTi - stick a turbocharger on the engine, throw in some big alloys, a tasty body kit and some bucket seats, stiffen the suspension and away you go. The 1.4 litre engine offers between 143 and 180bhp depending on which spec you go for, serious grunt in such a small car, and makes a

lovely sound while its about it. The Abarth is seriously fast in a straight line but, sadly, the handling doesn't live up to the performance; it lacks grip on the front end and the steering is too light. It also shares the same faults as the standard car, a back breakingly firm ride, lack of headroom in the back and a tiny boot. Still, it looks the part and offers good value too - £11,000 puts you in a 2017 car with less than 10k miles under its belt.

Suzuki Swift Sport

Hot versions of the Suzuki Swift have long been popular among the boy racer fraternity, but have stayed under the radar for the rest of the motoring public. The kids love it because of the rev happy engine, rorty exhaust note and brilliant handling. The steering is super precise with oodles of feedback and it's perfectly balanced in the corners. An all new model was introduced in 2018 with a torquey 1.4 litre turbocharged engine, and this makes the previous



version a serious bargain. The naturally aspirated 1.6 litre engine kicks out 134bhp, not bad for a car that tips the scales at just over a tonne. It's not the best-looking car ever but the big alloys and rear spoiler give it a sense of purpose. Inside there's room for 5, some comfy bucket seats and masses of kit but really the Swift Sport is all about the driving experience – it's king of the twisty back road. Better still, a 2016 car with tiny mileage can be yours for just £8,500.

Advice on using emollients safely

It's really important that those who use emollients, those who care for people who do, and healthcare professionals are aware of the potential fire risks involved.

While emollients are safe to use and a very effective treatment for many conditions, it's really important those who use these products take particular care near naked flames, especially smoking materials, cookers and heaters.

Emollients are moisturising treatments applied directly to the skin to soothe and hydrate it. They are used by people of all ages, from babies to the elderly, and can be used to prevent or treat dry skin conditions like eczema, ulcers, psoriasis and nappy rash. Emollients come in a variety of forms, including lotions, sprays, creams, ointments, bath oils and shower products as well as soap substitutes.

While emollients are safe to use and a very effective treatment for many conditions, it's really important those who use these products take particular care near naked flames, especially smoking materials, cookers and heaters.

The risk of fire is greater when emollients are applied to large areas of the body or when dressings, clothing and soft furnishings become saturated with emollient which leaves a flammable residue on the fabric, that can then be easily ignited. If you use emollients regularly, it is very important that you follow this guidance to ensure you are kept safe whilst using these products:

Keep away from fire, flames and cigarettes when using any type of emollients (both paraffin-based and paraffin-free) **Change clothing and bedding regularly** (preferably daily). Emollients soak into fabric and residues build-up which can increase the fire risk.

Wash fabrics at high temperatures. It will reduce the build-up of emollients but does not remove it entirely.

When applying emollients, take care to ensure that it does not soak into seating, soft furnishings and bedding. This is especially important if you spend extended periods in a bed or armchair due to illness or impaired mobility.

Tell your relatives or carers about your treatment. Make sure they are aware of the fire risks. Those who care for you can help to keep you safe by understanding and reducing the related risks. The outer packaging and product containers of your emollients should include a warning about the fire hazard.

Tell your doctor, nurse or pharmacist if you normally smoke. They will be able to offer you help and advice to stop smoking. 




