


Recipe: Chocolate and Clementine Tart with Amaretto Whipped Cream

550a 70% cocoa Chocolate, broken into small pieces 3 whole Eggs 220ml Milk 300ml Double Cream 250g Sweet Pastry 15 Clementine Oranges, squeezed for their juice 50a Suaar


400ml Whipping Cream A splash of Amaretto

Preheat the oven to 180°C. Start by rolling out the pastry thin enough to line an 8-inch tart mould. Line the mould with grease



To make the tart mix, place the chocolate in a bowl set over a pan of simmering water, making sure the bowl doesn't touch the water. Pour the milk and double cream into a medium size saucepan and bring to the boil. Add the egas and whisk guickly until incorporated into the cream, then pour the mixture over the melted chocolate and again whisk together thoroughly. Pour the chocolate mix over the syrup and fill to as close to the top of the pastry shell as possible. Pop it back in the oven and then turn the oven off. Leave the tart in the oven until the chocolate mix takes on a texture like custard. Remove and cool until you're ready to serve. Whisk the whipping cream until it forms soft peaks and then gradually add the Amaretto to taste. Serve a generous slice of the tart on to dessert plates. (You can glaze the tart using a blow torch if you prefer) Spoon on a dollop of Amaretto Cream and tuck in – gorgeous!

Yellowstone

Yellowstone National Park was established on March 1st 1872 and is nearly 3,500 square miles of wilderness atop a volcanic hot spot.

The world's first National Park is rich and vibrant, a true wilderness in the heart of America, and has been almost untouched for 150 years, approximately 96 percent of the land area of Yellowstone National Park is located within the state of Wyoming, three percent is within Montana, with the remaining one percent in Idaho.

Yellowstone features dramatic Canyons, alpine rivers, lush forests, hot springs and is the largest active Geyser filed in the world, including its most famous, Old Faithful which erupts approximately every 90 minutes, together with the Lower and Upper Falls which are almost twice as high as Niagara Falls!

There are also hundreds of colourful hot springs and pools such as the Grand Prismatic Hot Spring, which is larger than a football field and the third largest spring in the world. The best time to visit the park is during the summer months but even then the weather in Yellowstone can be unpredictable, because elevations inside Yellowstone National Park range from 5,280 feet to 11,400 feet, so visitors should not be surprised if the park's weather changes without a moment's notice.

For wildlife lovers the park is a haven, home to Grizzly Bears, (Yellowstone is actually one of the few places where Black Bears can be seen co-existing with Grizzly's) you will also see Gray Wolves and the world's largest Bison herd, together with Bald and Golden Eagles, Trumpeter Swans and Moose, all living freely in their chosen habitat, why not spend a day exploring on foot or hiking with a wildlife tracking expert who are experts in their field, they will teach you about the animals and their habitat, with hopefully a sighting or two! Yellowstone is in the middle of Cowboy country so don your boots and hat and get involved! Watch a Rodeo attend or stay at a guest ranch, the park has superb recreational opportunities, including hiking, camping, boating, fishing, there are a dozen campgrounds in the park so bring a tent and settle in, or alternatively opt for a hotel or lodge, the choice is yours!

LOCAL MEMORIES: What's in a Name By Penny Young

I have been doing family tree research for around 15 years, after becoming fascinated by the television programme, 'Who do you think you Are'. Recently I have turned to Mum's side of the family, having previously concentrated solely on the Banks'. If I thought Dad's side threw up a number of characters and far fetched stories, Mum's family have taken things on to a completely new level!

I had always been interested in a story concerning an aunt of Mum's - her mother's sister. There were four children in the family, three girls and a boy. Our grandmother, Vivien, was the youngest and the middle pair were twins, a boy and a girl.

It was always felt, by the grownups, that somehow the twins genes had become mixed up, as the girl was always the more dominant and masculine of the pair.

The boy was named Nicholas, as nearly all first-born sons in this ancient Cornish family were, which does not make research easy, when you have Nicholas, born to Nicholas, born to Nicholas, going back generations. The girl was called Rosemary; however, this tomboy of a girl did not like this girlie name and insisted that everyone addressed her as Jill!

Rosemary/Jill lived a fascinating life, emigrating to Australia in 1923, but never really putting down roots, bouncing backwards and forwards for the next 18 years or so, neither settling in Australia or England. We have just one photograph of her, seated on a horse, her back ramrod straight and indeed, it was the horsey world that led to the next stage of her life. Somewhere on a hunting field in the late 1930's, she met Terrence Hone and they married, she joining him at his farm, Brook House in Catworth.

Mum told us that she remembered that sometime during the War, a telegram arrived for her grandmother, (who was living with them at the time, in Australia.) informing her of the death of her daughter, Rosemary (Jill) in a riding accident. Mum said that her grandmother went to her bedroom and did not come out for several days. The story went that Jill went out riding one morning, around the farm tracks and that sometime later the horse returned to its stable, rider less. A search party went out and Jill was found, lying mortally injured and died the next day.

I decided to try and order a copy of her death certificate, to see if this is what really what happened. I went on one of the genealogy websites and entered all the information I had, name (Rosemary), date of birth, parents etc. but nothing came up. So I tried again, this time putting her name down as Jill and again, no luck. So then, I tried to find the marriage certificate, again having to do everything twice, but still no joy. So for the third time I decided to try to find the marriage certificate, just using Terrence's name. Eureka! I had found it; but Terrence had not married Rosemary, nor had he married a Jill, he had married a Pamela and what is more, she had knocked 10 years off her life! Pamela/Jill/Rosemary was actually a few months older than Terrence, but she had knocked exactly 10 years off her life and not only that, had changed her (deceased) father's name on the marriage certificate, from Osmond Lennox Kendall, to Leonard Kendall. The newlyweds were sadly only married for 17 months before the tragic riding accident, where yes, according to the death certificate, there had been a fracture to the base of the skull and internal haemorrhage into the brain, sustained when a horse she was riding fell and she was thrown onto the ground.

My final piece of investigating was to see if all these names appeared on her birth certificate, and I decided to go one better, ordering certificates for both the twins. A few days later, two brown envelopes arrived. I held them both in my hands, hardly daring to open them and willing it to be the baby girl's certificate that I opened first. It was! First of March, 1903 born at 12.30 a.m. a girl - Rosemary (no middle names!) The second envelope a boy - Nicholas (no middle names) born at 13.55 a.m.

I have to tell you, I sat and wept; this brave little girl older than her brother by one hour and 25 minutes had taken life by the horns and lived it the only way she knew how.





WITH the most romantic day of the year just around the corner, Valentine's Day is not just for those people who are already 'coupled up'.



Developing healthy habits at a young age will encourage healthy eating into adulthood; helping to avoid problems such as obesity and eating disorders. Eating breakfast is essential as it helps to maintain lasting energy throughout the day, it is a great habit to continue into adulthood too. "A child who never sees a green vegetable will become an adult who never eats a green vegetable!" With this in mind, offer your children a colourful snack of different fruits, or chop vegetables into interesting shapes to make them seem more fun and exciting, and your toddler can learn the colours at the same time! Don't be afraid to introduce your children to new or more exotic tastes. If your child rejects something, try again in a few weeks.

Drink water at meal times, and keep juice as occasional treats. OPINION: The Mysterious Case of the Missing Furniture

I know it's currently in vogue to characterise Amazon as a US tech giant (and therefore one of Satan's Disciples) but you have to admire its achievements. The other day I ordered something off Amazon at 7pm and it was delivered before nine the next morning. That is remarkable. Of course, Amazon is not really a tech company at all, it is an online retailer with a sideline as a TV broadcaster, and the secret of its success is excellence in logistics. Logistics is the science of getting things to where they're needed when they're needed, whether you're talking about a widget for a washing machine, some veg on a supermarket shelf or a new bed for your spare bedroom. Good logistics is what makes retail, manufacturing and much else besides work.

Most of us order tons of stuff online, anything from clothes to ink cartridges to light bulbs to makeup, and almost invariably everything is easy to buy, represents good value for money and is delivered very promptly. However, a couple of weeks ago, I decided to buy a new bed for our spare bedroom. I bought it from a prominent online furniture retailer that uses a well-known TV persona to front its advertising. The website was easy to use, the bed appeared to be good value and delivery was promised for the next day. But the next day came and no bed arrived, nor did it the day after. The following day half of it was delivered by a rather flustered courier who claimed he'd found the box kicking around in the warehouse. There followed an intensely frustrating round of phone calls, emails and broken promises before the other half of my bed was eventually delivered eleven days late.

I assumed that this was an isolated incident, but then I heard a similar tale of woe from a friend who had bought a table and chairs from another online retailer. In his case, the chairs got lost in transit and a replacement set had to be despatched, causing lots of delay and inconvenience. A quick check on Google revealed thousands of angry rants from disappointed customers of both retailers. In both cases, less than 20% of customers said they would use that company again and my retailer had an on-time delivery record of 29% - that is beyond abysmal! My top tip for 2020 is don't buy shares in an online furniture retailer. How can they get it so wrong when the likes of Amazon get it so right?

Having spent 12 years of my working life as a logistics manager, I think I may have the answer. Everything in modern logistics is automated. The people in the warehouse have a handheld computer that tells them what to pick and pack. Then the system prints a despatch label with a QR code that tells the courier's computer system everything it needs to know to get that consignment to its destination. In the courier's central hub, the box gets scanned and sent down a network of conveyor belts that make sure that it gets on the correct lorry to go to the local distribution depot, where the whole process is repeated. There's no need for human initiative and little scope for human error and that is why the system works so well.

The problem with furniture being despatched via a standard courier is, quite simply, that the boxes are too big to fit on the conveyor belts. This means that some initiative is required and suddenly there is a quantum increase in the scope for human error. What's the solution? Well, maybe the online retailers could use delivery companies that are set up to deliver large packages. But my advice is, if you want to buy some furniture, go to a shop. That way, you can see what you're buying and, with a bit of luck, you can stick it in the back of the car and take it home with you.





Reach for the (Green) Stars!

Why not have a smart new resolution resolution this year... or revolution, depending on how you look at it? If you're living in something other than a bungalow, take a look out of your bedroom window and take in all the roof spaces you can see – and now imagine them covered in a stunning little landscape of flowers and plants. These "green roofs" could be magnets for wildlife, with birds feeding on all the insects and seedheads, as well as soaking up all the excess rainfall and airborne pollutants. So, as well as maximising all your garden spaces, a new aerial layer would also tick all the right boxes for saving the planet, at the same time as transforming spectacularly dull structures into really special garden features.

The original concept of adding a layer of vegetation to a roof can still be seen in many Scandinavian and Hebridean communities. Even pitched roofs are often completely covered in the sods of grass and other vegetation that were dug out of the ground when the buildings were first built. This is obviously a very sustainable and cost-effective idea, but it is not done for decorative or wildlife benefits; it's purely for keeping out the worst of the weather and creating a cosy home.

Modern green roofs are more likely to be seen on large commercial buildings and they are now highly complex systems. They incorporate the latest waterproofing and protection methods for the roof itself, combined with lightweight substrates and effective water removal and irrigation processes. The planted surface is invariably a mixture of sedum succulent species as they are relatively cheap to produce, but they aren't particularly exciting. This refined technology and the requirement for all new developments to meet biodiversity targets means that green roofs are now an essential element in the construction process. It also means that for us gardeners the same principles can be applied to create simpler solutions on a much smaller scale, which can elevate a garden from a one-dimensional plot to a multi-layered landscape.

So, how do you start and how difficult is it? We've all got sheds, garages or porches and virtually any of these can be fitted with a green roof, provided you follow some very simple common-sense considerations regarding their load bearing capacity. Any wooden framed building would need the addition of bracing bars and strengthened uprights – but don't let that put you off as it's a relatively simple job for anyone with some basic joinery skills. Next you need to ensure that the roof itself is waterproof and has a seamless covering; again, not impossible for the likes of you and me. There is no definitive right way to build a small green roof and most successful ones have come about through experimentation and creativity. Rest assured that with a little research and some sage advice you can easily convert an existing building into one suitable for a green roof.

Once you've got your waterproof and stable building, you can then get on with the interesting bit – the planting! This is where you can really let your imagination run wild, as long as you remember that for most plants it represents a pretty hostile environment, fully exposed to sun, wind, rain and whatever else the weather has to throw at it, plus there is only a shallow depth of substrate to root into. However, despite these

spartan conditions, there is a vast palette of plants to choose from, in particular Mediterranean herbs such as Rosemary and Origanum together with small bulbs such as crocus and dwarf tulips. The image shows a shed with a green roof which we sowed with a mix of herbs, sedums and other dwarf plants over seven years ago. It doesn't have any form of irrigation and, with a bit of judicial weeding, keeps looking geat. Why not give it a go – trust me green roofs can be addictive!

Gardening Guru: Prunella's Comer

Happy New Year, I hope you are all looking forward to another gardening year (one that maybe isn't quite so unusual would be good). Unfortunately January could still be the coldest month, it is after all only just winter - although there are always some highlights in the garden such as tree trunks, coloured stems and twiggy shapes. There should be some colour about with early snowdrops and winter flowering shrubs, most of these are scented too, which is a bonus if you are out. This is the month to take stock of the garden, plan for the year ahead. With the garden at its barest now is perfect for seeing what you need to do and what plants to get. A winters day spent ordering new plants, seeds and bulbs is a job well done.

Most jobs this month will be maintenance, such as repairing fences, supports, gates etc.

Garden tools will benefit from some care, sharpening and oiling mainly. Tidying up sheds and greenhouses are a great job for a sunny but cold day, if you have stored tender plants check them over regularly for any signs of mould or pests. Normal gardening is of course still possible if the weather is fine, weeding and pruning. Try not to be too tidy though, leave areas for insects to shelter in.

Vegetable beds can be dug, and planned for the new season, there might still be some vegetables like carrots and parsnips which will happily stay in the ground ready for digging up. Broad bean seeds can be sown now. Winter is the best time for pruning fruit trees, so keep standard and espaliered apples and pears in good shape.

Plants for colour and scent at this time of the year include Mahonia, Viburnum, witch hazel. Other flowers are the hellebores, which will be looking great (cut off the leaves to show off the flowers, new ones will then have space to grow) and cyclamen. Snowdrops should be on their way up, and there are even some varieties that will be out now.

Cambs Fire & Rescue Service

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is looking for on-call firefighters to join on-call fire stations around the county. On-call firefighters aren't based at a fire station, instead they carry a pager and respond to emergency incidents as and when they happen.

The Service has introduced a new **daytime contract** to the on-call service, which allows people to be available to respond to emergencies from just **24 hours a week**, for example while working at their regular day job or from home.

The new contract is available for anyone interested in joining an on-call station, providing they can offer a minimum of **24 hours per week (between 7am and 7pm during the week)** and attend the weekly drill night.

On-call firefighters can be men and women that come from every walk of life. They may be at home, working for themselves or a nearby company, or even out in their local community. They must maintain their availability to respond to emergencies by staying within five minutes travel time of the fire station. They receive an annual wage plus additional payments for attending incidents and drill nights.
