

Recipe: Duck Liver Parfait, Soaked Prunes, Toasted Sour Dough

This easy to make starter is delicious and so much more satisfying than serving shop bought pate. Plus, it will win you bragging rights when it's your turn to host a dinner party.

Inaredients

500g Duck or Chicken Livers 300g Unsalted Butter

4 Whole Eggs

1 Diced Shallot

1 Clove of Garlic

50ml Port

30 ml Red Wine

100g Prunes

1 Earl Grey Tea Bag

Sour dough Bread

Method

To start, pre-heat the oven to 130°C. Put the red wine, port, shallots and garlic into a saucepan and place on a medium heat. Cook on a fast simmer until it has reduced by two thirds.

Place all the livers, eggs and butter into a blender and mix until completely smooth. Then add the reduced wine mixture to the blender, combine with the liver mixture until it is smooth once again, then pass the mixture through a fine sieve or muslin cloth to remove any gritty pieces.

Pour the parfait into a terrine mould or some small serving dishes. Put the mould or serving dishes into a deep oven tray and fill the tray with water until it comes halfway up the mould. Place in the oven and cook until set. Once set, remove from the tray and allow to cool for 20 minutes before placing it in the fridge until later.

Place the prunes in a pan and add water until they are just covered. Drop the tea bag in the pan and place on a medium heat. Simmer until all the water has been absorbed, then allow to cool.

To serve, either turn out the Parfait onto a plate or serve in the dishes. Season with a little salt and garnish with the prunes. Serve with toasted sour dough. Mark Osborne



Be armed with the right information in the battle against the scammers Eileen Le Voi, Safe Local Trades

IT seems that not a week goes by lately without warning of a new scam – with cyber criminals becoming more and more sophisticated.

An email from a supposed legal or Government source can be so convincing that it can fool even the shrewdest among us, as can a request to transfer money or pay a bill.

However, the fight against scams is hotting up. As well as the many reliable channels which can inform and advise about scams (including the UK Action

Fraud), there is also a user-friendly Friends Against Scams website - a National Trading Standards Scams Team initiative which aims to protect and prevent people from becoming victims of scams by empowering communities to 'Take a Stand Against Scams.'

Friends Against Scams is designed to inspire action, highlight the scale of the problem, change the perceptions of why people fall for scams and make scams a community, regional and national topic.

And what's more, Friends Against Scams offers a free, easy-to-use online learning service where anyone can learn about the different types of scams and how to spot and support a victim. The session – which takes around 15 minutes to complete – can be done in the comfort of your own home, in the workplace or even on your phone while on the move. When you have completed it – you will even receive a certificate. Visit https://www.friendsagainstscams.org.uk/training/friends-elearning to find out more.

With increased knowledge and awareness, people can make scams part of everyday conversation with their family, friends and neighbours, which will enable them to protect themselves and others.

Friends Against Scams also offer easily accessibly awareness sessions run by SCAMchampions, who are trained and supported by the NTS Scams Team. Each 45 minute awareness session is fun and interactive and a chance to meet other people who want to 'Take a Stand Against Scams'. The website will have all the details.

Scams can vary from postal to online. Don't be caught out by things like:


Phishing – this will most likely be an email from the 'bank' designed to trick victims into revealing personal information and passwords

Phishing: where you receive an email that pretends to be from an authority (e.g., your bank) in which you're asked to give out your passwords or personal information such as your address, telephone number, or other data.

Pharming - the fraudulent practice of directing online users to a fake website, which mimics the appearance of a real / leaitimate one

Romance Scams - a confidence scam whereby a criminal displays fake romantic intentions towards a victim in order to gain their affection to then extort money Impersonation of UK officials - criminals impersonate a UK official to obtain personal information by claiming that the victim is due a refund or must make an urgent payment Ad Clicking: where hackers encourage you to click on a link (perhaps by email, or on a webpage) which will then open malware or simply ask for your personal info.

Autumn Leaves us Guessing Paul Kinally of Peter Lane & Partners assesses the property market as we ease towards autumn.

Before we know where we are it will be autumn - 'Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness', as John Keats put it. But, for many this coming autumn, the mists of Brexit may eventually be lifted and we may be able to see where we are going for the first time in several years. This will be good for the property market, which has certainly been in the relative doldrums for a while.



That is if politicians will give us a break from tinkering with the property sector.

Reports that our new prime minister has some ideas about stamp duty changes and the opposition wants to after rental legislation yet again, reminds us that one of the biggest threats to a stable property market is politicians and their policies. If evidence were needed of our main political parties' indifference and lack of vision in the housing sector it is that we now have in place the sixteenth housing minister in 20 years – average time in post, fifteen months. The only ministers with any vision appear to have been those in the Exchequer who clearly see home sellers, buyers, landlords, tenants and sales and letting agents as cash cows. Another mist that seems to be lifting is the online estate agency one. After several years of confusion,

obfuscation, claim and counter claim, recent figures show that online agents accounted for only 7.3% of all UK exchanges in the second quarter of this year. With traditional estate agents commanding 92.7% market share it seems that the house selling public clearly knows which side its bread is buttered. Employing a gifted and experienced estate agent makes the most sense for those serious about selling.

As for mellow fruitfulness, we feel there will be no frenzy in the market this autumn. It may be mellow, but it will also be fruitful for those with an eve to moving before Christmas. With greater certainty in the market and with strong economic conditions there will be a widening choice as more property comes onto the market. With prices still relatively low this autumn should be the perfect time for a move.









Provide opportunities for floor-play, where there is space to move and push up from. Also give babies time to explore in different positions i.e. lying on their back, tummy or side, sitting, crawling, kneeling, or standing. Adequate strength is required in the back, tummy, hip and leg muscles to step forwards with one leg while balancing on the other.







From around 8 months old babies enjoy experimenting with their walking skills while being supported by an adult, reaching both arms above their head to hold adults hands. Please be mindful that, to develop appropriate postural control, this activity should only be done for brief periods and combined with other opportunities for supported walking e.g. cruising.





A toddler's balance, while standing, can be developed further by offering less support e.g. cruising around cardboard boxes/ironing baskets, as these are flexible, challenging the toddler's balance skills whilst moving around.

Walking is a process that is nurtured by attentive, sensitive and playful care. Enjoy this time, making treasured memories!

LOCAL MEMORIES: The Lost Cygnet By Penny Young

Fast forward to this spring and hurrah, a pair of swans arrived on the reservoir. They swam around for quite a few weeks and then began building a huge nest. Once completed, the female sat and laid one egg, at least that is all my sister could spot with her binoculars during the very rare times when the nest was unattended. We were so excited; this had to be our same pair of swans, returned from two years ago.

We felt like expectant parents ourselves as we waited for the chick to hatch. Finally, one morning, my sister noticed more activity than usual, with the male fussing around the nest and the female constantly checking under her spread wing feathers. The binoculars thought they had spotted something move, but were not sure. A further visit to the reservoir later that morning saw the proud swan parents on the water with not one, but four babies!

Our joy was again to be short lived. The next morning my sister went to the reservoir early, to check on the swan family. She scanned the water, no cygnets and worse, no swans. She walked round the reservoir peering in all the reeds, but to no avail, they had all disappeared. What could have happened?

Later that morning came a phone call from a friend who rides her horse through the farm. "I have found a cygnet". My sister retorted, "Well I have lost four!" The lady had found a tiny cygnet, running up and down peeping, falling over, getting up again, and peeping some more, at the top of its little voice. She had climbed down from her horse and gently picked up the distraught cygnet and leading the horse had carried the cygnet to her house. Our neighbouring farmer has a reservoir and my sister started to wonder if the swan family had somehow gone there. She leapt in her car and drove to the neighbouring reservoir and there they were, Mum and Dad swan with three babies. She then quickly drove to collect the lady who was looking after the lost baby cygnet. They drove back to the reservoir and gently lowered the still very vociferous cygnet into the water. Mum and Dad swan swooped over and guided the baby back to its brothers and sisters, the family reunited.

How could this have happened? This was the hottest day of the year and the poor little lost cygnet surely would not have survived for much longer on the dusty farm track.

Our friend from the RSPB was able to answer our questions. How had the swan family moved, probably nearly a mile to a new lake, with their youngsters, barely a day old?

Swan cygnets like other waterfowl (and some game birds) can walk prodigious distances hours after they have hatched. The parents obviously had knowledge of the other reservoir perhaps for some reason more secure, less threat from predators, better feeding etc- and simply walked the brood there. The cygnets will not be able to fly for several months yet. Opinion: The Value of Everything, the Price of Nothing

There's an old saying, "He knows the price of everything but the value of nothing." It's actually a disparaging commentary on people who are obsessed with money to the detriment of morals, ethics and society's other values. However, if you're referring to monetary value rather than more nebulous concepts of value, this old saying is no longer true. Thanks to the internet, you can work out the value of most things very easily. For instance, go on Autotrader and you can work out the market value of your car to within a few pounds. You can do the same thing with your home by using the valuation tool on Zoopla or by looking at what similar properties nearby have sold for recently. You would think that the same is true for the price of things, thanks to the ever-present comparison sites, but you'd be wrong.

Here's an example. We bought a car a few months ago. I did my homework beforehand and the car I found at a nearby dealer was priced at pretty much exactly what it should be for a model of that age, mileage and equipment level. I test drove it and all was fine, so I decided to buy it - and that was where the problems started. The car was subject to a non-negotiable £100 "service premium" which covered things like having it cleaned and checking everything worked – I thought car dealers were supposed to do stuff like that anyway. Then the salesman set about trying to flog us a bewildering array of insurance and servicing schemes before signing us up to a finance scheme for which he didn't know the APR. The upshot of it all was that we paid several hundred pounds more than the advertised price.

It's the same with Ryanair. You see a flight advertised for £80. It's going where you want to go at the time you want to go there so you decide to book it. But then you discover that they've changed the rules. You can only take hand luggage into the cabin if you pay for priority boarding; that's an extra £68. So you check it into the hold instead, but that's an extra £25 and to add to your misery, you have to hang around at the other side waiting for it to appear on the luggage carousel.

A friend of mine is in the process of buying a new build house. Although it is still being built, he has already paid a 10% deposit and the price has gone up by a few thousand pounds because he specified better carpets and a higher spec kitchen. He's also using the Help to Buy scheme and research has shown that buyers who use that scheme pay on average £33,000 more for their home than buyers who don't. So, in his case the price has gone up and is probably higher than market value to boot.

I think this situation has occurred because the internet has made it so easy to work out the market value of things. Businesses that advertise items at excessive prices will simply find that they get no takers so, in an effort to boost profits, they try to upsell additional services that are of little or no value – such as an insurance policy covering your alloy wheels that costs more than a replacement set of wheels and tyres! The thing is, I can't see what's wrong with charging a fair price and making a fair profit. Why should businesses make huge profits at the expense of their customers and then hand them over to their employees, like the chief executive of Persimmon Homes who awarded himself a £75 million bonus last year.

People aren't stupid and will vote with their feet. The chief executive of Persimmon has been kicked out of his job, Ryanair's profits are tumbling, and I will never buy another car from that dealer. What goes around comes around.

Used Cars: Big Prestige Estate Cars

Many people buy luxury SUVs for their practicality – seating for five and a big boot accessed by a tailgate. However, you can get all that practicality from a large estate car, together with far superior handling, performance and economy. Buy the right car and you also get all the comfort, equipment and prestige of a Range Rover or an X5. Starting with a budget of £15k, here is my pick of the bunch.

BMW 5 Series Touring

The sixth generation 5 series, launched in 2010, was a real game changer for BMW. Good looking, well equipped and a joy to drive, it was head and shoulders above the competition. The estate version is not quite as commodious as some of its rivals but is more than adequate for most people's needs. Most were sold with the 190bhp 2.0 litre diesel under the bonnet which is pretty quick and can manage 70mpg at a pinch. Expect to pay £14k for a 2016 model with 50,000 miles on it. If you really want to do the job properly, go for the 530d – 0-62 in under 6 seconds and 60mpg on a run. Pay £15,000 for a low mileage 2015 model; all the car you'll ever need, if a little bit predictable.



Mercedes E-Class Estate

The E-Class has long been the wheels of choice for everyone from taxi drivers to managing directors. We're interested in the fourth generation marketed in the UK from 2010. The E-Class feels like it's been carved from a solid block of metal, is immensely comfortable and has enough room to throw a party and have a sleepover afterwards. The E220 feels a little underpowered and I'd pick the E350 CDI which has all the performance you could want. Go for the post facelift model (2013 on), preferably in Luxury spec for all the goodies. There are a couple of downsides; the handling feels a little ponderous and it isn't quite as refined as some of its competitors, but these are minor niggles. The E-Class holds its value well – our budget puts you in a 2014 car with 80k+ on the clock.



Audi A6 Avant

Audi's A6 executive saloon has only been around since 1994 and originally felt like a poor relation to the E-Class and 5 Series. Later models did much to address that perception and the 4th generation, introduced in 2011, is one of the most stylish cars on the

road. Good looks aside, it's also supremely well built, particularly the interior, and boasts an excellent range of engines. As with all Audis, the ride is overly firm and the front wheel drive chassis isn't as involving to drive as the BMW. The interior, although beautifully crafted, can feel a little gloomy and the steeply raked roofline compromises space in the boot. Almost all of them came with the 187bhp 2.0 litre diesel which offers similar performance and economy to the BMW. £14k gets you a 2015 car with sub-50k mileage. The 3.0 litre diesel is something of a rarity and delivers strong performance and improved handling, thanks to standard 4-wheel drive. Our budget will get you a 2013 model with 70,000 miles on it.



Jaguar XF Sportback

Jaguar's executive saloon is much underrated in my opinion – it is good looking, goes well, handles even better and has the old -world charm and refinement that Jaguar do so well. It has two major problems: the 2.2 litre diesel is a bit of a duffer and there's a chronic lack of headroom in the rear. Jaguar offered an estate version between 2012 and 2015, which took care of the headroom problem; opting for the Ford sourced 3.0 litre diesel takes care of the underpowered engine. You can pick up a 2015 model with reasonable mileage for around £14k, It's a nice car to drive and own and you'll stand out from the crowd

Gardening: Confucius Say ...

Gardening is but a simple pastime - you plant something in the soil, give it some water, make sure it gets a bit of sunshine and, hey presto, you are in business. No drama, and on the face of it something which wouldn't tax even the most hopeless of grown-ups. For any kids reared on a diet of Blue Peter and hours of digging in the school garden it would be a walk in the park. The most baffling thing for the majority of us though is what are all these flowers called?

For those of us (not me I hasten to add!) who have been schooled in Latin, using the scientific names for the plants is a reasonable way of identifying flowers – a good example is the Sunflower for which the Latin name is Helianthus. The Helios bit means sun, pretty obvious eh? However, you would probably be bamboozled by something a bit more tricky such as Schizanthus. It doesn't get any easier when you realise that there are also alternative names for all these plants - normally derived from the local dialect, they are generally referred to as common names. To make matters worse, most of these common names are often duplicated and corrupted. So, a Black Eyed Susan can be either a North American Rudbeckia or the delightful climber Thunbergia which hails from Africa. Even worse are those slightly awkward names such as Family Jewels Milkweed, Nipplewort and Stiffcock - I kid you not, these are genuine common plant names and guaranteed to raise a giggle at the garden centre when you ask if they have any in stock....

I think that unless you are a complete plant geek like me, to try and memorize the scientific names of even your favourite plants is a big ask. If I had a pound for every time I've recited the name of a particular plant to people over the years, I would be a very wealthy man. As I am still scratching around to find the cash to keep my kids in Apple's finest gadgets, I have clearly missed one of life's great business opportunities! To be fair, I have always been slightly embarrassed about my ability to identify plants and feel rather more comfortable now that anyone, regardless of their geekiness, can do exactly this by using an app on their phone. Take a look at www.plantsnap.com or www.picturethisai.com. You can download the app to get your very own access to extensive databases containing hundreds of thousands of plant names. It still doesn't get you away completely from the issue of confusing common names or your phone giving up the ghost at the crucial moment - but it does help if I or any of my fellow geeks are not around at the time!

The other infuriating thing with plant names is that they often change for no apparent reason. Just when you think you've cracked the Latin names of some of the more common plants in your garden, the boffins discover that actually they've got it all wrong and change it. Take for example the good old *Chrysanthemum*, which is recognised virtually anywhere in the world and who's Latin name is actually also it's common name. Well, you'll be pleased to hear that this has now been re-named *Dendranthema* and caused generations of gardeners to un-learn a plant name that is as familiar as a *Rose* or a

Snowdrop.

The plant name minefield gets even murkier when you throw in the unscrupulous machinations of the commercial growers, who make up completely fictitious names for plants simply to give them some selling power. You might be tempted by something called Hot Ice down at the garden centre, but as Confucius famously said, "An oxymoron is worth two in the bush!"

Gardening Guru: Prunella's Corner

The holidays are over, hopefully we will have had some rain to keep the summer bedding going but the nights should be cooler and Autumn is not far off. The garden will be gearing up for another flush of colour if it has been planted with some of the many later flowering perennials, so there's no giving up now.

If it is still dry weather keep watering and feeding, dead head regularly as this will keep new shoots coming. Plants that have finished flowering and are done for the year can be cut back to give room for the ones still going, and to make the garden look a bit tidier. September is the start of the season for moving evergreens, and splitting perennials, if you do this make sure plants are kept well watered (at least once a week with a full can for each plant moved) until they settle for the Autumn. Hedges can have what will probably be their last trim this year.

Spring bulbs, such as snowdrops and daffodils can be planted now.

Vegetable gardens will still be going strong, keep an eye on temperatures and if the nights get too chilly cover crops such as salads and courgettes with cloches and fleece, this will ensure they don't succumb to cold. Carrots and brassicas should be covered with netting so the carrot fly and cabbage white butterflies are unable to get to them. If tomatoes are still growing but there will not be enough warmth for them to ripen, leave them on the plants as long as possible and then take the fruit off the plants and take indoors to ripen.

Plenty of plants to choose for colour this time of the year including: all varieties of Aster,

Chrysanthemum, Helenium and Hyrdrangeas.

Cambs Fire & Rescue Service

Throughout the year and particularly as the winter months draw in, we begin using our fires, burners and chimneys once again to warm our homes.

In Cambridgeshire 83% of chimney fires occurred between September 2018 and March 2019. The highest recorded fires were in the coldest months of the year; totalling 44 chimney fires. As the UK is about to enter in to autumn, it is the perfect time to clean out your chimney.

Follow our 'top tips' below to ensure your home is kept safe and warm all year round.

Chimneys and Fires

- Have your chimney swept once a year or more frequently if you burn wood
- Avoid burning resinous woods that quickly build up soot
- Only burn fuels suitable for your burner (eg. never burn anything other than wood in a wood burner)
- Do not overload the grate/ appliance
- Do not bank fires too high and remember to let them burn out well before you go to bed
- Check the hearth, floor and furnishings near the fire for hot sparks/embers
- Do not place objects on or over the mantelpiece which cause you to stand too close to the fire in order to reach them
- Use a fire/spark guard to prevent accidental fires and make sure it has the kite mark or conforms to British/ European standards
- Inspect your chimney breast, particularly the roof space. Make sure it is sound and sparks/fumes cannot escape through cracks or broken bricks.

Wood/Multi-Fuel Burners

A qualified and competent engineer should install all wood/multi-fuel burners and boilers – regular maintenance should be undertaken to prolong the working life of the appliance. Specialist servicing and maintenance will usually be provided by the company you purchase the appliance from but you can also refer to www.solidfuel.co.uk for advice and information

- Ensure correct ventilation is in place when the appliance is in use
- Wood burning appliances should only use the right quality wood recommended by the supplier
- Regularly inspect the chimney and flues
- Generally wood should be well-seasoned (usually wood kept dry and stored for around 2 years)
- Avoid wet or newly felled wood as this will cause tars/ creosote deposits forming in the burning appliance and chimney
- Using laminated chip boards will leave binding glue deposits
- For each slow burning period there should follow a quick burn to dry out unwanted tar/creosote deposits and to warm up the chimney again
- At the end of each burning season and at least once during the season the entire system should be cooled and thoroughly cleaned to maintain top performance.

Most importantly

- Fit a smoke alarm that carries the kite mark or British Standard Number 5446 and test your alarm weekly by pressing the test button and know the life of your battery.
- Always also install a CO alarm in the room where the burner is installed. Chimney Fires continue to be a common occurrence in home fires in the winter months.

We experience an average of 81 chimney fires a year in Cambridgeshire alone. Whatever fire you have, or fuel you burn, it is vitally important you have your chimney swept to avoid a build-up of ash and soot.
